# **Curriculum** Focus

# **English (Inquiry)**

In Term 4, students will create a written narrative text using ideas drawn from a familiar text. They will also read, view and comprehend an imaginative text. Students will:

- Plan their narrative.
- Consider their character, setting and plot.
- Organise ideas in simple paragraphs.
- Use language features to tell story clearly.
- Engage their audience.
- Use simple and compound sentences.





- Build descriptions using adjectives and noun groups.
- Adding meaning with verb groups.
- Use correct tense throughout.
- Use topic-specific vocabulary.
- Review and edit their writing.
- Independently read a chapter from an imaginative text.
- Provide short written responses to this text.

### **HASS**

### **Inquiry HASS:**

In Term 4, students explore places near and far to answer the inquiry question 'How and why are places similar and different?' Students will:

- Describe the diverse characteristics of different places at the local scale and identify and describe similarities and differences between the characteristics of these places.
- Identify connections between people and the characteristics of places.
- Explain the role of rules in their community and the importance of making decisions democratically.
- Locate and collect information from observations.
- Interpret data to identify and describe simple distributions.
- Draw simple conclusions and share their views on an issue.
- Record and represent data in different formats, including labelled maps using basic cartographic conventions.
- Reflect on their learning to suggest individual action in response to an issue or challenge.
- Communicate their ideas, findings and conclusions in oral, visual and written forms using simple discipline-specific terms.

### Mathematics:

In Term 4, students continue to develop their proficiency and positive attitudes towards mathematics and its applications. They will:

- Use practical activities, observation or experiment to identify and describe outcomes and the likelihood of everyday events explaining reasoning.
- Conduct repeated chance experiments and discuss variation in results.
- Order and represent numbers beyond 10000.
- Solve problems involving 2 and 3-digit numbers.
- Find unknown values in number sentences involving addition and subtraction.
- Create algorithms to investigate numbers and explore simple patterns.

#### Science:

Students will enquire into the Earth's relationship with the Sun, and how the Sun, Earth and Moon interact. They will learn that the rotation of the Earth on its axis causes regular changes, including night and day, and the pattern of the seasons.

#### The Arts: Music

This term in Music, students will continue learning to name notes on the treble clef and will begin reading and performing simple three-note melodies on the glockenspiel. They will also listen and

respond to Saint-Saëns' *Carnival of the Animals*, exploring how music tells stories through instruments.

### **Health and Physical Education: Health:**

Students investigate the concepts of physical activity and sedentary behaviours while exploring the recommendations of physical activity for five- to twelve-year-olds. They examine the benefits of physical activity and investigate ways to increase physical activity in their lives.
